- Articles in English, Portuguese or French will be subject to a new review process, made by invited anonymous reviewers, experts in the respective themes.
- Have clearly defined the Aims & Scope.
- Publish a statement of Conflict of Interests in accordance with the recommendations in the Uniform requirements for manuscripts Submitted to Biomedical Journals: Writing and Editing for Biomedical Publication <a href="http://www.icmje.org/icmje.pdf">http://www.icmje.org/icmje.pdf</a>
